
Title of Work The Legend of King Gargunt

Briefly describe your design. (Limit 250 words)

We would like to create a mural all around the folklore tale of King Gargunt. It says he sits under the castle today, surrounded by treasure and ready for battle, so we want to make him and the castle the main subject. In the centre of the design, crossed over both wall and canopy, the castle shape (echoed throughout the mural) will hold a crown representing the King, as well as a plethora of weapons and treasures. Underneath will be one small box of text [please see attached documents]. The background of the mural will be a dark blue map of surrounding areas of Norwich, areas tales say King Gargunt frequented including three illustrations of places the Queen was believed to have visited in 1578; areas Gargunt may have had his rainy misfortune, leading to him missing his opportunity to meet the her. All 'box' elements will be shaped as the castle, and have underneath small boxes of information, either folklore based or factual. The map background will be blue tones, whilst the box outlines and images will be an off white. We will use representations of each place, on an accurate map of Norwich; this allows the piece to be viewed from afar, as well as appreciated in more detail when the viewer has the time.
